

Values Theme Ideas

Drawing a value or emotion

Age Level: All Ages

Suggested Time Allowance:

Variable

Objective: To express or represent a feeling or value in a drawing

Activities: Participants write the theme on paper and draw what the theme looks like with pen, pencil, pastels or paints.

Other Ideas

- Write the "theme" with synonyms and antonyms on paper and draw what the related or opposite theme using a drawing program.
- Create a Cartoon on the "theme"
- Use digital camera take picture of objects representing theme or of pupils acting out a still life of the theme
- Short Add on theme... advertising/selling it! Video it.
- Create metaphors/similes for the theme
- Short story on the "care and feeding" of the "theme"
- Interview someone on the theme.. adult to class, use conference phone, send them an e-mail asking them how it appears in their life/work
- Keep a class journal/diary on when we saw the theme happening in our lives. When we saw other people showing the theme
- Write a recipe for cooking up the theme
- Mind map to explore ideas related to **theme** .
- Skit or theatre piece that explores **theme**
- Create a collage that expresses **theme** .
- Create a cartoon.
- Write a poem.
- Use a variety of materials to build a sculpture.
- Create a booklet on the care and feeding of your **theme** .
- Create masks of how **theme** looks.
- Do Interviews with people or organisations that illustrate the theme
- Choreograph a dance.
- Create a video.
- Take a photograph... find objects and build a "sculpture " of theme. Act a still-life statue of the theme and take photo
- Create metaphors on the theme

Use the Hats



Red hat feelings

Look at the positive side (Yellow hat) and negative of the theme (black hat).
