TRY ONE TODAY!

When people go phishing..... they might email you, call you on the phone, instant message, Twitter or convince you to download something off a website. Some even send you fake invoices in the mail!

How to spot fake...

1. No banks or financial institutions will ever send you a message saying you need to login and change account details or that there has been a difficulty...
2. You can check the link in behind the URL (in blue and underlined usually) by hovering over it.. often there will be a miss match i.e. says kiwibank but points to <http://janesweb.com/index.php> DO NOT CLICK!
3. If you didn't subscribe to the site then it is SPAM or a scam anyway.
4. What is the tone of the email? Scammers often make threats.... "if you don't reply in 24 hours your account will be terminated"
5. Spelling or English grammar is often poor.
6. They often use stolen graphics from the real site.
7. Sometimes a whole site is designed to rip off people, it looks like the real one but is a fake. The URL at the top will usually not be correct however!
8. Keep virus checker and adware/scam checkers up to date!
9. If in doubt DO NOT click on the link!

Use the following cards to help train your investigator skills. They are all based on genuine emails received... genuine genuine and genuine fakes!

Note: some emails or names have been blanked to protect privacy.

Man sentenced over racist tweets about Newcastle United

A football fan who posted racist comments on Twitter directed at Newcastle United has been given a suspended jail sentence.

Sunderland fan Peter Copeland, 29, had admitted two offences under the Malicious Communications Act.

The comments, in January, were an attempt "to wind up" a Newcastle fan, magistrates in Sunderland were told.

Copeland of Benridge Bank, West Rainton, County Durham, was given a suspended four-month jail term.

He was also ordered to complete 150 hours community service.

'Regretted actions'

During the incident, which followed Newcastle United's signing of Senegalese striker Papiss Cisse, Copeland made derogatory comments about striker Demba Ba's appearance and the number of black players in the club.

He told police the comments started as "banter" with a Newcastle fan.

District Judge Roger Eisey said the four-month jail term was warranted because of the "grossly offensive" racist comments.

However, as Copeland had pleaded guilty, and "deeply regretted" his actions, the sentence had been suspended.

"I hope you understand you must never again use racist abuse of this nature," Judge Eisey told him.
